Recyclable E-Waste

Hoonah Indian Association and the City of Hoonah are teaming up to conduct Hoonah's 1st ever e-waste recycling event! During the week of June 24th from 8am-4:00pm we will have a collection station set up across from the community play ground next to the Conex, if you are unable to come to us we can come collect your e-waste.



E-waste is old electronics that are collecting dust and ready to be thrown away such as old phones, old tv's, old coffee pots etc. Many electronic devices are made with and contain chemicals and metals that are extremely hazardous to our environment when left in a open dump environment; these chemicals can leach into the soil and enter our fish streams and when burned can be released into the air causing dangerous ambient air quality. We want to help the community dispose of these toxic environmental hazards responsibly.
